We're thrilled to announce that the match has been made, helping us raise a **record total of \$121,086.27** through the **2024 Monterey County Gives! campaign**. As shared in our December newsletter, our **Annual Book Wrap** was a huge hit! A total of 1,140 students in Monterey County gifted new books to their little ones, creating special moments of shared reading.

MPUSD Collaboration - Parent Education

Our ten-session parent education collaboration with **Monterey Peninsula Unified School District (MPUSD)** kicked off in January at **Ord Terrace Elementary School** in **Seaside**. RtMP Program Coordinator, **Esmeralda Carranco**, shared this about the first session:

*"MPUSD Parent Ed at Ord Terrace Elementary was **an A+ all around**—for the district, Read to Me Project and the community. Seven mothers joined our first Saturday morning session, **excited to be introduced to the Abriendo Puertas/RtMP curriculum**. Our session was taught in Spanish to support their home language and foster a sense of mutual encouragement. **We laughed, we learned, and we shared.** The mothers spoke about their challenges but also celebrated their victories, lifting each other up. **They left feeling reassured, knowing they weren't alone in their experiences.**"*



MPUSD Collaboration - Reading Partners

We're excited to return to **MPUSD** for both school-day and afterschool classes! Select 5th and 6th grade students at **Del Rey Woods** and **Ord Terrace Elementary** (both in **Seaside**) are reading to TK, K, and 1st grade students as part of our spring semester Reading Partners program. RtMP Program Director, **Kathy Tojaga**, shared:

*"MPUSD Reading Partners is off to an incredible start, showing **the power of community and mentorship**. Sixth graders, initially shy about reading to younger*

students, quickly discovered that not only was it easier than they expected—it was fun! Laughter and excitement filled the room as they practiced engaging little ones through pictures and storytelling.

This energy and confidence spill over to the TK and Kinder students, who look up to their 6th-grade reading partners like older siblings. **Inspired by their mentors, these little ones are building a love for reading—one joyful story at a time.**"
